### The Standard's apology.

When ignorance is bliss' tis folly to be wise; such is the school-boy's refrain, and it is a pity that all Editors are not bound to keep it cons tantly before their eyes. It happens that our particular friend the "Tribuna," not well understanding the easy flexibilities of our Anglo-Nexton forigue, has fallen into a strange error and poured unmerited abuse on our unpretending and amiable journal. We are charged with ridiculing the country whose bread we eat, and attacking the conduct of Mitre's troops. Our horror of the Junea sees has been too often expressed, to admit the idea that we have any sympathy for San or his myrmidons. On the contrary we look with confidence to the hero of Pavon, whom we have defended from the attacks of his own press. For this end our article of yesterday demands a clearing up of some particulars in Flores' despatch. Far from accusing that General, of inhumanity, we have said, and repeat it, that "Laprida y Marin " may attempt to retort the crimes of Saa on " their captor, but it can never be said that " they met the fate of Aberastain, since on the contrary they have been well treated when " captured." Who, that has common sense, can suppose us capable of comparing the bloody affair of Pozitos against which we have so often raised our roice, with the recent feat of arms. In the former we find a National Commissioner with peace upon his lips enter

» Provisco with savage hordes, slaughter his enemy who were arrayed in self defence, and butcher (under kis own eyes) unarmed prisoners. Flores is admitted by us a gallant offieer, and the Cunida Gomez, on his escutcheon, will bring no stain; for, he and his officers exerted themselves to spare the Federal troops when victory had declared for him.

It is true he surprised the enemy, of whom he killed a large number, but, let us remember, this is in open legitimate warfare, which permits surprises,ambuscades et hoc genus omn If Flores, or any other, had suffered the butche ry of prisoners, mither the omnipotence of the Varelas nor the terrors of a dungeon could prevent us from repeating the cry of horror we Assed after the affair of Pozitos. We do not est our words nor flinch from our strict duty as leader of a public organ; and if our readers would know why we have not joined in the secret cry that Canada Gomez has been another Pozitos, let them learn the details of our late action.

Let the Editors of the Tribuns consider themselves especially excepted when we profeas the utmost regard for the people amongst whom we live. It is true we gain nothing by the natives and owe them nothing, but, the courtesy of life obliges us to consider as hospitality the permission to live in the country. It may be the charms of society in Buenos Ayres are sarcastically enhanced by our opponent, but he displays alike his ignorance and bad taste when he refers to our birthplace with a sneer, as if we were born, in a mudhut, of bog-trotting parents. The appeal to foreigners, to put us down, is in vain : our columns must be made of the right stuff when our Weekly issue exceeds -600, and our daily 260; Thus 2,000 of our papers are read per week, while our sickly contemporary [whom the Tribuna elevates to the rank of being our rival] cannot count one-'ourth that number, unless indeed a certain friend takes 300 at a time, as some still think. But one short mouth ago, one of our editorial brethern threatened us with silent contempt, yet we are still flourishing while he has sunk into obscurity, leaving his late journal as a sepulchral monument of blighted hopes and misguided efforts.
