Republics are at a discount, and since their initiation those of South America have never reached par-Statesmen have puzzled themselves to discover whether the failure was attri butable to those who made the experiment, or inherent in the system. We should be inclined to lay the blame on both; although so many arguments may be adduced pro and contra, that we will content ourselves with remarking that not one single republican of the most enthusiastic patriotism could regard the praises of South American Governments, and denunciation of "rotten European monarchies," freely uttered on last Sunday, as anything better than yulgar bosh.

None better than Argentines know the tiresome chronicle of civil wars. revolutions, invasions, tyranny, exile, crime, disorder, and lawless violence of every kind which constitute the history of Spanish republics for the last fifty years. These countries seemed to have forbidden the approach of the civilization of the 19th century, and resolved on a plan of self-destruction, at the same time accusing the mother-country of having given them a bad education.

Their natural resources were stupendous, witness the Peruvian Governdous, witness the Peruvian Government extracting every year Three Millions £ sterling from the Chincha islands. Yet what progress have these republics made? comparatively none! for there is not one on a level with any of, our English Colonies. Why, all, the republics from Mexico to Cape Horn are collectively a mere trille compared to Canada, India, or Australia. Think you that if Beresford had held his ground in B. Ayres, we should now be hourly troubled with Indians, or suffer the paper money endemic, or or suffer the paper money endemie, or go begging for a railway, or cross the Andes on nules? Look at Melbourne! its streets are drained and paved : thirty years ago it was a swamp, and now it is the Paris of the Southern hemisohere. Look at Canada I and its Grand trunk railway: when will Peru or La Plata boast a Victoria Bridge to rival the Pyramids or Chineso Wall of antiquity? Look at India, with the gigantic fruits of civilization grafted on the empire of the Mogul. BRAZIL AND MONTEVIDEO.

For some time previous to the Saraiva mission, the Oriental Government had hoped for signal assistance from its Imperial neighbor, and the press of Montevideo made the Cabinet of Rio Janeiro act as a counterpoise to that of B. Ayres, since the latter aided the filibusters. At one time the Brazilians were coming in force to crush the rebuls at another they had placed a military cordon on the frontier to prevent the fugitives of Flores' army from escaping. Meantime the rebels were receiving countenance and supplies, from Brazil, and it was evident that the Imperial policy was, to flatter both combatants. until a pretext should arise for interfering and imposing its will on the exhausted republic.

When Sar Saraiva started for Montevideo charged with formidable and the Brazilian Cubinet, in reply to the Argentine Minister (Sor Marmel.) declared that this was the last anicable step of the Imperial Government Hardly had the Brazilian fleet dropped anchor at Montevideo when the envoy commenced his demands. The murder commenced his demands—The murder of Brazilian subjects, unpunished by the authorities, was a plea for proposing that 'facuarembo and same other 'river ports should be occupied by Brazilian garrisons, a concession beyond the power of Pres Mitre's Government,

and an abdication of independence.
We will not enter into the alleged outrages, which made such noise in the Brazilian Chambers, nor defend the Oriental authorities; but much allowance must be made for a country in civil war, and it is strange that Brazil should adopt the same vigorous policy towards Montevideo, which she condemed in the case of G. Britain, respecting the Prince of Wales ship-wreck. It is notorious that Brazilians formed the bulk of Flores' filibesters and cherefore forfeited all right to protection from their Government.

Nevertheless Sor. Saraiva had a protext for bullying the Oriental repub-lie, and his ultimatum being rejected, he broke off all relations with Presi-dent Aguirre's cabinet. That matters had come to a serious crisis, there can be no doubt, for it has been necessary to call in the mediation of the Eritish Minister at Buenos Ayres, the Argentino Secretary of Foreign affairs, and Sor. Lamas Oriental ex-minister at Rio

Janeyro.
The coincidence of Pinzon's scizure of the Chincha islands and Maximilian's departure for Mexico seemed to augus budly for the unhappy Oriental repub lic, as if Brazil meant to annex Monte-video. We confide, however, in the resolution of England and France to maintain intact the independence of Banda Oriental.


