#### The Standard's apology.

When ignorance is bliss' tis folly to be wise; such is the school-boy's refrain, and it is a pity that all Editors are not bound to keep it constantly before their eyes. It happens that our portionlar friend the "Tribuna," not well onderstanding the easy flexibilities of our Anglo-Saxtin fongue, has fallen into a strange error and poured unmerited abuse on our unpretendieg and amiable journal. We are charged with ridiculing the country whose bread we eat, and attacking the conduct of Mitre's troops. Our horror of the Junea wee has been too often expressed, to admit the idea that we have any sympathy for San or his myrmidons. On the constary we look with confidence to the hero of Pavon, whom we have defended from the attacks of his own press. For this end our article of yesterday demands a clearing up of some particulars in Plores' despatch. Far from accusing that General, of inhumanity, we have said, and repeat it, that "Laprida y Marin " may attempt to retort the crimes of San on their captor, but it can never be said that they met the fate of Abcrastain, since on the " contrary they have been well treated when " captured." Who, that has common sense, can suppose us capable of comparing the bloody affair of Pozitos against which we have so often raised our spice, with the recent feat of srms. In the former we find a National Commissioner with peace upon his lips enter » Province with savage hordes, slaughter his enemy who were arrayed in self defence, and butcher (under kis own eyes) unarmed prisoriers. Flores is admitted by us a gallant offieer, and the Cunnels Gomez, on his escutcheon, will bring no stain; for, he and his officers exerted themselves to spare the Federal troops when victory had declared for him.

It is true he surprised the enemy, of whom he killed a large number, but, let us remember, this is in open legitimate warfare, which permits surprises ambuscades et hoc genus omne. If Flores, or any other, had suffered the butchery of prisoners, muither the omnipotence of the Varelas nor the terrors of a dungeon could prevent us from repeating the cry of horror we raised after the affair of Pozitos. We do not ext our words nor flinch from our strict duty as leader of a public organ; and if our readers would know why we have not joined in the secret cry that Casada Gomez has been another Pozitos, let them learn the details of our late action.

The regiment of Machado after the battle of Payon found 40 of their wounded comrades with their throats savagely out by the beaten enemy, and as is natural, these men vowed to wreak an equal veugeance upon the murderers. It may be, readily supposed, that in the order of pursuit and with so dire a memento, this regiment would have have annihilated the foe; but, for the honor of humanity and glory of Buenos Ayres, the officers and general threw themselves between the pursuers & the fugitiyes, saying the lives of all who surrendered to them.

Thus 2,000 of our papers are read per week, while our sickly contemporary [whom the Tribuna elevates to the rank of being our rival] cannot count one-'ourth that number, unless indeed a certain friend takes 300 at a time, as some still think. But one short mouth ago, one of our editorial brethern threatened us with silent contempt, yet we are still flourishing while he has sunk into obscurity, leaving his late journal as a sepulchral monument of blighted hopes and misguided efforts.

The Railway question is pre-eminent in interest, and there is every reason to expect the Southern Line will be passed into law. The Landed commission of the senate having summoned Mr. Lumb and one of the Engineers to their sessions it is clear that the project has received from them a preliminary acceptation. #### FOREIGN MISCELLANY

The gold field of Now Zealand had suddenly become very productive. About 300,000 ounces had been received in Sydney in one week, and 700 onnees in Melhbarne. This was magnified into 7000 ounces, and several steamers, were at once laid on for Otago.

The Treaty of Commerce begins to work. A Bonen paper states that there are in Havre 100,000 tons of English goods waiting for carriage to Paris, and we learn from Lille that English goods are also pouring into France by way of Belgium.

Letters from China-to the P ris Union state that the festival of Corpus Christi has been celebrated with great pomp in the Catholic cathedral of Pekin, and that afterwards a procession paraded the streets.

A concordat has been published between the Pope and the President of Haity. It creates an archbishopric of Hayti, and four bishoprics. The Pope is to nominate, and a special article allows the selection to be made from the white

Sir Henry Bulwer has given his small steam-yacht to the Sultan's eldest sop. His juvenile highness took personal posession, and seemed delighted with his property, rummaging cabin, engine-reom and forecastle with the liveliest curiosity and satisfaction.

THE ATLANTIC COMPANY -The Prince Albert screw steamer of the Galway line was sold last work to a Spanish company, to run between Cadiz and Havannah. She will be replaced by a paddle steamship suited to the requirements of the G dway service. The Columbia is being re-riveted throughout; the bottom plates are being doubled, and sheet bulworks, built, or rather a forecastle to extend near the foremast found. The following changes are reported as being immediately contemplated in the directory : -Mr. Malcolmson is to retire from the chairmanship, to be succeeded, we believe, by Mr. Gurney; and Mr. Robinson, a director connected with Mr. Malcolmson, for Mr. Chapman, who is well known to the banking interest—Galumy Press.

Collignies-The total number of collieries in Great Britain at present is estimated at 2,654; of these 1,433 are in England, 235 in Wales, 405 in Scotland, and 71 in Ireland. In 1857 the coal of the United Kingdom exceeded 65,000, 000 tons. The value at the pit's mouth of quantity annually raised is estimated at 16,700,000i, and its mean annual value when consumed, at about 20,000,000l. Besides this sum, it is estimated that the iron extracted yearly from the coals rai-sed is worth, at the mouth of the fireace, 14 millions sterling. The total capital invested in the trade is supposed to exceed 184 millions sterling. In 1851 the number of persons employed in our dual mines was 219,000 at present there are a quar-
