Everyone who cares to know anything about the country will read with pleasure the life of this distinguished Irishman. We believe that he was the only foreigner who ever filled the chair of Governor of this country. We look toward with pleasure to the continuation of the chapter in the February number.

The next chapter is a trustation from Dominguez's history of the Argentine Confederation. As we are all acquainted with this work in the text, we have nothing particular to remark, save that its translation into English we regard as extremely useful. Had the gifted historian confined his talents to the paths of literature, we would feel less he-sitation in praising the depth and research of the history in question, but unfortunately we find ourselves deprived of this pieusure owing to the present position which M. Dominguez occupies in our political world. Strange indeed tion which M. Dominguez occupies in our political world. Strange indeed does it seem that a man who is so intimately acquainted with the history of this country would not prefer the historians clair to any place or office under a South American Government. Do minguez as an historian holds a foremost rank in the River Plate, but as provincial financier, minister, or politician, we regret we cannot say so much.

The third chapter, "A Commercial Report of the Trade of the Argentine Republic, to the end of 1862," by our esteemed and talented Consul Hutchinson, of Rosario, abounds in valuable
