PROTRACTED QUESTION.

It frequently happens that a trifling matter of politics suffices to embroil a whole kingdom or even several States.

The capital question in Buenos Ayres is somewhat similar, and the real matter at issue is lost sight of, in the smoke and bustle made by the combatants.

There is an advantage in these protracted questions: that they seldom terminate in a configuration, and though the political atmosphere be surcharged, the short-lightning is harmless and the storm resolves itself into a genial shower.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

Buenos Ayres is at last out of mourning for the King of Denmark, and people seem to have regained their wonted cheerfulness.

The weather seems at last about to break. Yesterday, in the morning, there was a great appearance of a storm, which every one in the country is anxiously praying for.

The vigilantes, being in the same state of clearheadedness as their superior, did not wait for second orders, but commenced cutting right and left.

The lady was severely wounded on the head with the butt end of the renarque, and is now confined to bed. The Comisario Leguizamón now appeared upon the scene, and ordered the two prisoners to proceed under charge of the Alcalde.

A sad case occurred the other day in Chascomus. An unfortunate Irishman, who had been imbibing a little too freely, was arrested by the 'alcalde,' beaten terribly with the flat of the sword, and taken off to Chascomus, where he was put in the stocks.

We have no news whatever from Flores; in fact, people are getting so imbued with the 'crudo' and 'cocido' war, that we have no time to think of the would-be regenerator.

The 'Pavon' leaves to-day for Rosario.

SCANDALOUS OUTRAGE.

We are indebted to the 'Tribuna' for the following:

On the 14th inst. about 3 p.m., in the street of General Brown, a scandalous affair took place. Nino, the Alcalde of that district, in company of another person, both on horseback and intoxicated, passed along that street.

Nino, insulting the Doctor, seized the reins of his horse, and dealt him so severe a blow that Deroxeux fell down.

The Alcalde dismounted, and showing him, ordered him to go along as prisoner. "Leave me alone," said the Dr., "and I'll go."

The vigilantes, being in the same state of clearheadedness as their superior, did not wait for second orders, but commenced cutting right and left.

Naturally enough this scandalous row attracted the attention of the neighbours, who called out to Nino to spare the Doctor; and one lady, unable to witness such a scene, addressed herself to the Alcalde, requesting him not to allow an old man, who was already down, to be so badly treated.

On the way, the Comisario told Deroxeux that his gold lace did not matter one straw; and on the Doctor replying, he received more blows.

It is patent in the Boca that the Comisario received notice from the Policia that the process formed against him for the disturbances on the day of the elections would be quashed, and that on account of this pardon, the alcalde and vigilantes were going about with sword and pistol in hand, shouting 'Down with the Gringos!'

This Nino was one of the principal

followers of J. Moreno, Chief of Rosas' policy. But this is not all: the same day the alcalde met a neighbour, Juan Beruty, to whom he owed some money, and although Beruty said nothing, he was attacked by Nino, taken prisoner, and placed in the stocks till sundown, when he was allowed to go free.

TARPEIAN ROCK.

We consider it our bounden duty to warn our newly-arrived countryman against many delusions into which he may very easily slide.

1st. That when a Government, like that of Buenos Ayres, is wishful to encourage foreign emigration, the city Municipality should take a little trouble to preserve the limbs and character of the emigrants.

2nd. That in this city of Buenos Ayres, which fondly calls itself the Athens of South America, great pains would be taken to uphold its character as such, by removing mantraps from the public streets.

3rd. That, judging from the state of the first thoroughfare he sees, after landing, the whole of this country is the same.

What has prompted us, on this occasion, to speak so seriously to the new arrivals, is simply the shameful state in which Calle Cangallo, between 25 de Mayo and Paseo de Julio has been left for many years past.

In days long since, when a common sewer broke down in Rome, and left a ugly hole, which the paving commissioners of these days could not repair, one called Quintius Curtius (he must have been 'raw'), determined to take a 'honder' into it, as he had an idea that, by so doing, it would close.

MINISTER ELIZALDE.

We perceive, in yesterday's 'Tribuna,' a rather severe attack on Dr. Rufino Elizalde, Argentine Minister of Foreign Affairs. The alleged reason for abusing the Minister, is his incompetence in the finance department.

He accepted the charge of the Hacienda Department, influenced by the patriotic motive of assisting President Mitro, when Dr. Veloz Sarafield prematurely resigned.

ROSARIO RAILS.

The Ferro-carriil of Tuesday, had nothing important. A masked ball took place at the theatre on Sunday night.

Datos from Catamarca are to January 9th. Sor Maubecin, brother to the Governor, died; the official organ says he was greatly regretted, but mentions nothing of the summary executions, imprisonments &c. for which this delightful locality and its Governor have become so justly celebrated.

Cordoba is said to be on the verge of a revolution, the opposite factions being greatly inflamed. Gov. Ferrera's term of office expires in February, when the President of the Chamber will rule for three days: the elections will then come off.

We have the 'Litoral' of the 14th and 15th inst. Carrigo celebrates the second anniversary of his journal, and ridicules the victory of Pavon. His election as Deputy to the Provincial Legislature has been ratified, but he declares himself nowise indebted to General Urquiza.

PARANA.

Operatic performances, including airs from Trovatore, Traviata, &c. are given in the theatre by Mdme. Builli (who sang in St. Ayres with Mollo) and Sig. Olmos.

Some Jesuits of the Sts. F's College are on a visit to the ex-metropolis. Beron still remains under trial, but at liberty.

FLORES.

A report was current yesterday that Flores had sent agents to buy up all the old muskets. There is likely to be some foundation for a report of this nature, only instead of Flores, read Berro, on account of Flores. We saw some double-barrelled fowling-pieces sold at the high price of 30 dollars, at an auction store in San Martin.

PILAR.

The camps of Pilar are by no means in that splendid condition they are reported to be in; the part on the northern side, and towards the Parana, considering the year, good, but nothing more; and even to this there are exceptions; but however good they may have been, it is impossible they can remain long so, in consequence of the quantity of stock now grazing on them.

Our local registrars are very busy just now with electioneering stratagems; horse-racing is again permitted at the pulperias, with a view no doubt to encourage the vagrant Gauchos to bear Divine service at the 'ramada' of the pulperias.

THE DROUGHT.

We have seen a meteorological table, drawn up by Sr. Eguia, pointing out the quantity of rain which has fallen in Buenos Ayres during 1861, 1862, and 1863, according to a rain gauge, elevated 7 varas from the ground, in an isolated position.

In 1861 least rain fell, as is shown in the small number of 24.15 inches. In 1862 fell 43.59 inches; and in 1863 29.53 inches.

In September, October, November, and December the quantity was: In 1861 349.5 inches. In 1862 410.8 do. In 1863 170.3 do.

Herein lies the cause of the drought. The country owes many thanks to Sr. Eguia for his scientific researches.

STATE OF THE CAMP.

LOCAL EVENTS.

Rain.—There is every sign of a change of weather, and a timely shower would rescue several of our estanqueros from impending ruin.

Accident.—We regret to learn that Sr. Bilbao's child has had his arm broken. A journalist in this Christian and civilized city has had the good taste to say "this a divine chastisement" because his politics are objectionable.

Lacivits.—We notice two fiscal questions with the firms of Thompson and Tompkinson, touching muslins and their difference from 'imitation paup's cloths.'

Cheap Sheep.—A native estanciaero who has already lost 40,000, offers the remaining 30,000 at 90 mpc each, or to anyone who will guarantee him 10,000 after the drought.

The Dusky Family.—These celebrated acrobats have at last arrived—and give a performance to-night in the Colon Theatre. They are, according to the judgment of those who have seen them, superior to the Leccs bros. One of their most surprising feats is the Jump over Niagara. If they should fall into that river, the enthusiasm of the spectators might be somewhat damped.

General Massacre.—Since the commencement of the sanguinary struggle in the United States, from various causes, such as death on the field, from sickness and from crushing, the Federals have lost 60 generals, whilst the loss in the Confederate side, from the same causes, has been 66 generals.

The Mercedes Outrage.—An account, very different from that we published on the 16th inst., appears in the 'Tribuna' of yesterday. Diaz, the official of that partido, has come down to Buenos Ayres, on account of the bad feeling entertained towards him by the British in that district.

Some of them, the British, are reported to have said that, rather than allow Diaz to escape, they would lose every sheep they possessed. It also appears that previous to this unfortunate affair, Diaz was a general favorite in the Villa.
