ARRIVAL OF THE MERSEY

Yesterday morning the royal mailsteamer Mersey, Captain R. Curlewis, arrived in port, bringing news of great importance from Europe.

In England Parliament had been opened by Special Commission. The Marquis of Sligo, wearing the uniform of the Royal Irish London Volunteers, moved the Address in the House of Lords; and Lord A. Grosvenor, who wore the uniform of the Cheshire Yeomany, in the House of Commons. Lord Derby, in commenting upon the Queen's speceli, paid a most graceful compliment to the Queen and the Prince of Wales, but afterwards delivered a most powerful invective against, the milk-and-water administration of the present Government. and in the plainest manner possible stated that the British empire was in danger. Mr. Whiteside, in the House of Commons, in his usual sarcastic and eloquent style attacked the Ministers for not mentioning anything about Ireland in the Queen's Speech. It is quite evident that the Tories are determined to do their best at this session

termined to do their best at this session to ture Lord Palmerston out.

The invasion of Schleswig-Holstein, by Prussia and Austria, had created the profoundest sensation on the London Stock Exchange. Earl Grey, and nearly all the leading men of England, declared that war between England, and Prussia and Austria, is inevitable.

The Chilian catastrophe had caused a thrilling sensation in England. The Times' devotes a leader to it, and throws all the blame on a priest named Ugarte, and the indiscreet use of parafin oil.

The Flowery Land case had terminated, resulting in the conviction of even of the criminals for murder, all of whom have been sentenced to be hanged. The Argentine Central Railway Com-

pany had not yet been introduced on the Stock Exchange, in London, al though the rate of interest had fallen to 64 per cent., but the Bank rate had not been reduced.

Buenos Ayres Bonds, 6 per cent., were sold at 89, which shows a rather serious fall: they seem, however, to have gone up to 90 the day before the leaving of the packet.

Around his neck was the pallium, from which was suspended the pectoral cross of gold. His feet were clad in purple stockings, with shors of purple velvet and gloves upon his hands of the same colour. He were upon his fingerithe same ring with which he was consecrated, 26 years exactly from the day upon which he was buried. On one side of the coffin was placed the crozier, and on the other the episcopal cross. At the foot two crosses of evergreens and white japonicas. After the office for the dead, and grand Mass of requiem, a funeral discourse was preached by one of the bishops. At the conclusion of this discourse the ceremonics of last absolution were performed, all the hishops present taking part, each in turn intoning the offices and passing round the body, sprinkling upon it holy water, and swinging over it the censors filled with burning incense. The remains were horne to the vault near the door by six priests of the diocese, preceded by the bishops, and followed by the family and relatives of the decoaved, the priests chanting the Benedictus. The concluding prayers at the vault were read by Bishop Timon, and the body was again sprinkled with holy water and incensed, and lowered to its last resting-place. The Archbishop was buried on the 26th anniversary of his consecration as bishop. He died on the day of his patron saint, St. John, and had often expressed a wish to die on that day. 
