The State of the Streets.—After long time, and a deal of talking on the part of El Nacional, the Calle Corrientes has been put in a state of repair, and is now no longer such a break-neck pass as it formerly was. If the police are at last listening to the words of reason and wisdom, even the cauciated by a "crónica," we would have hope that our small say may have some good effect. Whilst a street like Corrientes, away in the back of the city, not much frequented, is mended, is there any cause why Camargo, between Mayo and Páez de Julio, should still be left in a state of disrepair? The quarters of that beautiful, health-inspiring promenade, the wooden boardwalk, except the Mole?

Chair in the University.—One of our native colloquies speaks in high terms of a new chair which has been placed in the University. In other countries when we speak of a chair in a university, we generally mean the man who occupies it, or more frequently the class of learning taught there. But here, in Buenos Ayres, the people seem to confound the man, the subject, and the article of upholstery together, and speak of "the chair" being of hard timber, and manufactured in the country.

Bullfight.—On the last trip from Rosario, made by the Páez, he brought 218 gold ounces, 1,338 silver dollars, and 27 marks silver.

Body Found.—On Sunday last there was found drowned in the river at San Fernando a man whose face presented marks of violence. It has not been recognized, nor is there much chance of its being so, in the absence of a Morgue in Buenos Ayres.

Starved Out.—Sir Charles Napier said that he could keep the Punjab in a check with an Englishman, after his dinner, a light Irishman, and a starving Scotchman. The Argentine Government would appear to think that their countrymen are like North Britons, better able to fight, if half-starved, for not content with sending the men out to guard the frontiers, they make them face a worse enemy—General Rosas.

The Colonel of the 9th Regiment of the National Guard, stationed near Lobos, addresses a piteous despatch to the Provincial Government, stating that 61 of the National Guard, out of 100 which marched on the 27th July last for Azul, have returned, as they had only three months' rations delivered to them, and were now starving of hunger.

It is bad enough, in all truth, to be taken from one's regular occupations, to go and commit murder, at thirteen pence a day, Irishmen, and the slow death of starvation, but they might well exclaim, with Bird of Freedom Gavina, when requested to enlist for the Mexican war:

Maritime Intelligence.—On the 11th inst., the General Garibaldi entered Montevideo, with the captain and crew of the Princess Louise, and was welcomed on the Lobs Island by "G. Something like Advertising.—In the "Evening Standard" of 5th ult. the London firm has 15 advertisements; these occupy one whole column of the newspaper, and, taking them at the reduced rate of three shillings, must cost £2 15s., or £13 5s. Buenos Ayres paper currency. A very pretty

little sum to pay for advertisements in our paper for a single day; but no good loss ensues, as it has been found from experience that advertising expenses are rapidly repaid by the increased profits of the business.

Not quite sure on the subject.—Some folks are now at realizing either great grief or great joy, and, like puppies, require more time to fairly understand a thing, but when they do, happen to open their eyes they are about the clearest. Just fancy a man and woman being married six and a half months before they can get over their modesty sufficiently to publish the fact to their friends. In the "Times" of the 23rd January last we read in the list of marriages, a notice of the 9th July, 1864, at All Saints Church, Norfolk, "squire," &c. It would seem as though the two parties had, by tacit agreement, taken one another on trial, "the goods to be returned if not suitable."

Burglary.—The house of Dr. Zapata, in Calle Olavarría, was, we are informed, entered by some robbers last week, but the family and their valuables were given and the fellows succeeded in escaping.

Table of Exchange.—The indefatigable manager of the Bole, Mr. Rom, has just sent to press a table of exchange adapted to the new calculation of patacons instead of doubloons. Messrs. Mackers have purchased the copyright, and it will be published in a few days.

Prison Birds.—The six assassins who escaped from the Cabildo are enjoying themselves, probably at their former sanguinary calling. Perhaps after the elections on Easter Sunday, the Government will have time to take measures for their arrest.

The Pa on.—This steamer is undergoing temporary repairs, and the Espigador will take her place, in bringing down the tiossario mail-to-day.

Leopoldo.—The Bole will give an entertainment shortly at Colon; we do not know if this be the professor of that name who gained such reputation for his art.

Shut out.—This splendid composition of Rossini will be performed on Palm Sunday evening by the Italian Opera Co. Of course the theatre will be crowded.

Attempted assassination.—The native papers make much noise about an alleged attempt to murder General Fausa, but the fact is, that the General, at present recovering from his wounds, is at the hospital, and the attempt was a failure.

Harvest for the Poor.—The most important news from Europe is the formation of an Irish regiment in aid of the King of Denmark. They are all stated gentlemen from the Co. Cork, and will be called the "Alexandria Cent-Regt," equipping and maintaining themselves without any pay whatever. When Irishmen go all round the world to fight "for the sport of the thing," it is a dangerous omen for the peace of Europe.

No St. Patrick's dinner. We regret to state that there will be no celebration this year, as hardly a dozen gentlemen accepted our invitation. The fault is not ours, but unavoidable circumstances.

Great Loss. We are told that an Irish gentleman in the North lost one fine sheep on Sunday night; they died of exhaustion.

Attempted Escape.—Last Sunday night the prisoners confined in one of the halls of the prison attempted to make their escape from their hospitable friend's police. According to the testimony of one of these, the instrument used in their flight was a gun given them by the wife of one of their comrades who had lately paid her husband a visit. They had commenced making a hole in the wall between the police office and that of the Tribunal, but luckily before they had proceeded far with their work they were discovered. ON CHANGE. March 16, 1814. Patrons opened at 29.33, and went up to 20.10, at which price they closed. The bulk of the market was 18.00. For the middle of April, 4.000 at 29.33; a sale of fifteen thousand patacons was made to day, payable in sums of five thousand, at the end of the month of April, May, and June, at 29.30. The meeting at the Casa de Moneda today was the first since the introduction of the new money, and it is positively stated by many brokers that there are more orders than usual from outside. It is said that once they are going up the river to the legislator, but this cannot possibly have such an effect on our market as is pretended. When we recollect the enormous amount of foreign coin which has been introduced into Buenos Ayres during the past 12 months, and the very trifling amount

which has left or been taken away, it seems almost incomprehensible how, in the absence of any new emissions, paper money should so depreciate. Still causes are 470 and looking up; verily the rottenest monetary system in the world is the paper currency of Buenos Ayres. It is in vain that we speak on the matter; either the nation is unable to redeem the paper, or there is not a man in the country capable of dealing with the subject. The paper dollar is a chain round this country which is dragging us down to hopeless bankruptcy. We all look up to St. Gonzalez to see what measures he will adopt; with integrity and strict economy he can effect a good deal, but we fear not enough to rid us of the paper currency.

The Espigador arrived from Rosario with 85 passengers and a good cargo, and she brings no news whatever from the interior. No mails have arrived from San Juan.
