Writings in Yauco.
To the Editors of the Standard, Gentlemen,
By the time this is in the hands of the public, the churches will be full of worshippers. On Saturday night the theatre will likely be crowded more densely than ever it was in the palm days of the Lee Brothers; and what have the authorities done to prevent a repetition of the Chilian disaster of the 8th December last? Have any regulations been made for the proper fastenings of doors of public buildings, and have we again to hear the death-cries of people who, but a few moments before, were listening to pious accents of holy music?

The Municipality has been warned repeatedly of the hidden danger of fire in which this city is wallowing—death is abroad in our streets; and should the epidemic, which is called typhus, now ravaging the Island, make its appearance at this hour, precautionary measures will be found to be of no avail, and the Great King will claim subjects from all ranks, from the President to the street-sweeper. After we have suffered just punishment for our want of care, a day of fasting will likely be appointed to pray for these troubles to be averted from our heads. *Corazon?* Don't let's hasten will, by that time, have been gathered and the cures, not loud but deep, of desolated fathers, sisters, and children will be shrouded upon the head of a stubborn Municipality.

LOCAL EVENTS.

Santiago del Estero.—The "Ferozar" of Rosario, says that the man of the navigation of the Rio Salado is prospering. At first it was feared that a scarcity of labourers would seriously affect the undertaking, but now, luckily, these apprehensions are dispelled, and in order to further the good work, as far as lies in its power, the Government has decreed that the workmen, whilst employed on such works, shall be free from military service. By this means, it is expected that there will be no great scarcity of hands; and as further inducement for the men to keep steadily at work, this license is annulled as soon as they stop work.

Emplemen.—A party, who evidently does not wish to hurt the feelings of his neighbours, advertises in one of the

native newspapers:—"If the person called X, who wears a gold watch and chain, by mistake from such a street does not return the same, his name will be published." There is a degree of delicacy about this, whilst in this hot weather, is quite refreshing. We have heard of some of the swell mob in London being so absent-minded as to put their hands into other people's pockets, and instead of being unceremoniously rebuffed, have been sentenced to severe flogging. But we never before heard of a man who so publicly declared his belief in the absent-mindedness and intentional innocence of the gentleman who took a gold watch and chain by mistake. This trait augurs well for the kindly feeling and morality of the Buenos Ayrense public.

The Conquistador.—This steamer, after being completely overhauled, has been placed on the station between this and Montevideo, and is now likely to run regularly, as it is said that she has received special licence from the Blanco Governor to enter the neighbouring capital. To-morrow she will make her first trip.

An Argentine Marshall Haysman.—The Argentine shipper mentions the following:—"The Governor of Cordoba began to suspect a sergeant of being much inclined to Navarro. The sergeant keeping out of the way, his wife was seized and flogged, in order to make her divulge her husband's hiding place: she refused, and was again flogged, and died from the effects of this torture. If this does not come under the head of Haysman's crimes, we should like to know what does."

A coming fight.—The Progress mentions that the Confederate cruiser "Florida" is on her way to meet her, two leagues from French waters, and have a fight. It is expected that the fight will take place about the beginning of next month, and our next English packet will bring us particulars of the Shannon and Chesapeake affair.

ON CHANGE.

March 26.
Patrons opened at 20.10, and closed at 20.15, but there was no animation whatever on the Bolsa. The cash sales amounted to \$2,477. For the end of the month of April, \$3,000 at 20.15. For the 16th April 600, at 20.10. Total sales, \$1,067.

On Change to day, there was a very slight advance, as the majority of the distinguished brokers were in the Plaza at the "funicion."

There were a few Bills of Exchange passed on, English at 100 s. 6d., and many merchants were surprised that the Government had not remitted, by this packet, to meet the payment of the interest on the bonds in England, but the interest on these bonds, we believe, does not fall due until the 12th of July, therefore the Government can remit by next packet in time to meet this payment.

It is rumored that the National Government is negotiating a loan with the Bank Baur for five thousand patas, but the report is erroneous. The Bank has acquired a large credit for the National Government in account current.

Dr. Don Estevan Rana; we are happy to hear, has at last obtained a concession from the Government, exempting all persons employed at the Sa de works from military service. This is of the greatest importance to Mr. Rana's undertaking, as there was a great scarcity of persons in Santiago del Estero.

Specie is becoming slightly more in demand, as many merchants have to remit ounces of silver to the sale clerks, who are beginning to work. Paper money is also in good demand, and with a very slight effort, on this part of the Finance Ministry, ounces might be brought a little down.
