2nd—The liquidation of the sums belonging to the sections of Paper Money Sub-
scribers will be administered according to Article 31 of the Statutes, and for account of
those particular sections.

By these means the Directory hopes to gain its object which is to enable the
poorer classes to enjoy all the advantages of the Society.
