INCENSE AND EXPENDITURE OF THE BUREAU OFFICE.

A return was published on Thursday of the great public account established by the Government for the year ended the 31st of September last, and also for the year ended the 31st day of December in the same year, together with an account of the balances in the Treasury at the commencement and at the termination of the year...

The total ordinary expenditure was £27,800,987 11s. 10d. The excess of income on ordinary expenditure was £1,529,632 13s. 11d.; and when from this sum the amount of £260,000 for fortifications, the net surplus was £2,029,632 13s. 11d.

In looking over the items of income we find that the amount produced by each principal source of revenue is as follows:—Customs, £23,640,421; excise, £17,007,115; stamps, £9,000,252; taxes (land and assessed), £3,700,208; property tax, £298,809; Crown lands (land and assessed), £1,890,295 5s. 9d.

The expenditure consists of the following items:—Interest and management of the permanent debt, terminable annuities, interest of exchequer bills, and interest of deficiency bills, making the whole cost of the national debt, £26,218,268 11s. 10d.
