Slit hides also are very firm, and show an upward tendency; we believe, however, with the exception of one saladero, all the salted hides for the season are already contracted for.

It is with the greatest satisfaction that we learn that all the shares of the Argentine Central Railway have been subscribed for, with the exception of about fifteen hundred, which is hoped will be taken up by some of our Argentine capitalists before the arrival of Mr. Wheeler, which is expected to be in July.

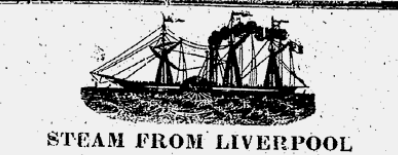
