Ball times on the Bolsa—everything talked about and going on with speculation in specie. A sympathetic but enterprising broker, finding business so monstrously dull, started a subscription for Mr. Flores, of Buenos Ayres. The brokers responded manfully to the call and a decent sum was got together in an hour. The list is still open and we hope to see a few more names put down. Exchange brokers are very busy, and bills were paid on England at 49 1/2 on a short basis. We heard of no changes to-day, but the salient side men were very busy, and there was no such thing as getting one word of information from them to-day. The "Nancy Riley" had arrived at Bahia Blanca, but the Irish gentleman found that the whole wharf was lost this year.

It is a common saying among people in Buenos Ayres, when talking about the fluctuation of the paper money and the rise and fall in specie, "that there is great speculation going on," but we hold that this is utterly incorrect, for within the meaning of the term there is not a speculation in the River Plate. The specious paper money which infests this country is jobbed about, and run up and down by people destitute of capital, but who enjoy a Balaicera. Speculation, in the true sense of the word, is utterly unknown in the River Plate. Our President, Ministers and Congressmen, who are worked to death in legislating and voting a country, even half peopled, would be surprised to learn what our pigny European speculator could effect in the River Plate. Possibly at some not very distant period a London or New York speculator may make his appearance on our Bolsa, but at present foreign men cheat hold aloof, and dabbling in papers is limited to a coterie of incapable men causing much harm, and utterly powerless to effect any good. The fact of the matter is, that for the last few years we have watched closely Bolsa affairs, and we can assure our readers that the reason why ounces do not rule to-day at \$320 is because merchants who have goods to sell find it inconvenient, and men who have capital speculate now-a-days in houses in the city or lands in camp in preference to ounces which are never forthcoming or paper money without a guarantee. To former years fortunes were made in ounce speculations, and rich men ruined, but times have changed wonderfully, and the extent of the gains or losses now-a-days on the Bolsa average are two thousand depreciated dollars. It is amusing to hear ounce brokers attribute the decline in their business to the change in quotations from ounces to patacons; it is laughable to listen to the grievances of a purely artificially commercial body. The fact of the matter is that foreign coin is now becoming not only so plentiful but so current, that the intervention of the specie broker is now hardly requisite. We all recollect when it was said the Germans are leagued and hold the specie, or the English have combined and possess the paper, but those are events of the past. Such rumors are no longer current. Why? Because there is not a foreign speculator in the Plata! Every day business is declining on the Bolsa—people are beginning to see that the most ruinous of all speculations is in the currency of the country. If the brokers seek to retain their business, it behooves them to introduce stocks, shares and bonds, for now-a-days people can buy and sell patacons without going near the Bolsa.

Horrible as war is in all its features, assuredly it has no greater horrors than the long agony of the poor captive who, when the feverish excitement of the contest is over, is left to the bitter charity of strangers and foes, without one friendly hand to soothe the pains of body or friendly voice to whisper hope and comfort to his despairing mind. These men, cut off from the assistance of their kindred or the protection of their Government, have peculiar claims on the pity and sympathy of the countrymen in Europe, and upon Christian benevolence everywhere. They did not recklessly or from choice embrace the profession of arms, but in exchanging the comforts, and often the luxuries, of home for the toils and hardships of a soldier's life, they obeyed a stern sense of duty and the love of their country.
